




We have arrived at week 5 and it's already been autumn for a while. Time does fly, doesn't it? Now, it's only right that we're making a warm blanket. When we get to November and December we can already enjoy it by putting a bit of it over our legs. This week we'll be making some squares again. Later, they will complete our blanket and they will make the blanket somewhat different than the last Cal. We'll get to it. Enjoy, people!!

Ch 4 with colour 2017/2019/2010 and make it a round by fastening it with a slip stitch in the 1<sup>st</sup> ch.



### Round 1

Ch 5. \*Make 3 tr in the round and Ch 2.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* 2 times. Now make 2 tr and close the round with a slip stitch in the 3<sup>rd</sup> of the 5-ch starting chain. You now have 4 sets of 3 trebles with in between them 2 chains.





### Round 2

Make a slip stitch in the first 2-ch space. Ch 5 and make 3 tr in the same 2-ch space. \*Ch 1 and in the next 2-ch space make 3 tr, ch 2, 3 tr.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* 2 times.

Ch 1 and in the next 2-ch space (the same of the 5-ch and 3 tr) make 2 tr. Close the round with a slip stitch in the 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of the 5-ch starting chain.



### Round 3

Make a slip stitch in the first 2-ch space. Ch 5 and make 3 tr in the same 2-ch space. \*Ch 1 and in the next 1-ch space make 3 tr. Ch 1 and in the next 2-ch space make 3 tr, ch 2, 3 tr.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* 2 times.

Ch 1 and in the next 1-ch space make 3 tr. Ch 1 and in the next 2-ch space (the same of the 5-ch and 3 tr) make 2 tr. Close the round with a slip stitch in the 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of the 5-ch starting chain.





#### Round 4

Make a slip stitch in the first 2-ch space. Ch 5 and make 3 tr in the same 2-ch space. \*Ch 1 and in the next 1-ch space make 3 tr. Ch 1 and in the next 1-ch space make 3 tr. Ch 1 and in the next 2-ch space make 3 tr, ch 2, 3 tr.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* 2 times.

Ch 1 and in the next 1-ch space make 3 tr. Ch 1 and in the next 1-ch space make 3 tr. Ch 1 and in the next 2-ch space (the same of the 5-ch and 3 tr) make 2 tr. Close the round with a slip stitch in the 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of the 5-ch starting chain.




#### Round 5

Make a slip stitch in the first 2-ch space. Ch 5 and make 3 tr in the same 2-ch space. \*Ch 1 and in the next 1-ch space make 3 tr. Ch 1 and in the next 1-ch space make 3 tr. Ch 1 and in the next 1-ch space make 3 tr. Ch 1 and in the next 2-ch space make 3 tr, ch 2, 3 tr.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* 2 times.


Ch 1 and in the next 1-ch space make 3 tr. Ch 1 and in the next 1-ch space make 3 tr. Ch 1 and in the next 1-ch space make 3 tr. Ch 1 and in the next 2-ch space (the same of the 5-ch and 3 tr) make 2 tr.

Now don't close the round but pull on the loop until it approximately measures 10-15 cm long. Cut the loop open. Now pull out the end that holds the skein of yarn and string the other end through a blunt darning needle. Now darn the end through the top 2 loops (the little v) of the 3<sup>rd</sup> of the 5-ch. Now string it through the top loop of the stitch where that end comes out of. Do you see how nice this finishing touch is? Now darn in the ends neatly.



Now make an additional 11 squares.

I've also blocked these squares. This way, I know that they are all the same size. As for myself, I used my special granny blocker, but you can easily do this with pins and little mats.



This is the end of this week already. Many squares, but not too difficult. On the whole, they will fit in very nicely and are essential. Have fun!
