



This week we'll be making some progress on the middle part of your blanket. You can put the granny squares aside for the moment. Are you feeling up to it? There is a nice stitch this week. I've used it before, for a whole blanket. You can find it on my website, it's called 'Een zee van kleur' ('A sea of colour'). In this Cal I call this stitch "Tiled path", a very fitting name if I do say so myself. It fits with the rest very well and looks a lot like an actual tiled path. There we go! We will begin with colour 1240/1820/1710.

#### Row 98

Ch 1. (does not count as a stitch). 1 dc in the first stitch and in all the others to the end. On the last step of the last dc change to colour 2017/2019/2010.



#### Row 99

Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch). 1 dc in the first stitch. \*Ch 3, skip 3 stitches and make 1 dc in the next st.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* to the end of the row. On the last step of the last dc change colour to 1240/1820/1710.



### Row 100

Ch 3. In the 1<sup>st</sup> 3-ch space make 4 tr. Continue to make 4 tr in all 3-ch spaces to the end. Finish the row with 1 tr in the 1<sup>st</sup> dc of last row. On the last step of this tr change colour to 2017/2019/2010.



The attentive crocheter will have seen here that it looks like I've make a mistake concerning the front and the back of the work. The dc rows you see from the back, whilst you see the tr rows from the front. This is quite right!

I've had long thoughts about this, turning the dc rows over and over to see which side I liked best. In the end, I've chosen to take the back side of the dc rows as the 'good' side. It makes the blanket a little tougher. The backside of the dc rows was a little more robust, more clearly present and that made me decide to take the 'wrong' side (if there are any good and wrong sides) as the 'good' side.

If you disagree with me and you don't want it this way that's just fine too. Then you'll just have to fasten off the thread more often and attach it to the other end of the row.

### Row 101

Ch 1. Make 1 dc in between the 1<sup>st</sup> and the 2<sup>nd</sup> tr. So you are not crocheting it in the stitch on top, but you put your hook between the 2 tr and finish your dc as usual. \*Ch 3. Skip 4 tr and make 1 dc in between the next 2 groups of 4 tr.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* to the end of the row. So your next dc is in between the last group of 4 tr and the 3-ch starting ch of the previous row. On the last step of the last dc change colour to 1240/1820/1710.



### Row 102 to 109

Repeat row 100 and 101

**Row 110**

Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch). 1 dc in the first stitch. \*In the 3-ch space make 3 dc. 1 dc in the dc inbetween the 2 3-ch spaces.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* until the end of the row. On the last step of the last dc change colour to 2018/1708/1054. You are now back at 157 stitches.



**Row 111** (for pictures see row 12 of week 1)

Ch 1. (does not count as a stitch) 1 dc in the first stitch and all stitches to end. On the last step of the last dc change to colour 1123/1011/1081.

**Row 112** (for pictures see row 13 of week 1)

Ch 4. Skip the 2<sup>nd</sup> stitch. In the next stitch make 2 tr tog. For this you do a yo, put the hook in the stitch and pull up a thread. Do another yo and pull the thread through the first 2 loops on your hook. Do a yo, put the hook in the same stitch and pick up a thread. Do a yo and pull the thread through the first 2 loops on your hook. Now you do a final yo and pull the thread through all 3 loops on your hook. Ch 1. \*Skip the next stitch and 2 tr tog. Ch 1.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* until you have 2 stitches left. Skip 1 stitch and make 1 tr in the last stitch.

**Toer 113** (for pictures see row 14 of week 1)

Ch 4. \*Skip the ch-space of the last row and 2 tr tog in the next stitch. Ch 1.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* to the last 4 chains of the last row. Skip 1 ch and make 1 tr in the 3<sup>rd</sup> of the 4 ch. Fasten off.

**Toer 114** (for pictures see row 15 of week 1)

On the other side attach colour 2018/1708/1054 on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of the 4 starting chains. Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 dc in the stitch of the 1ch. 1 dc in the next ch-space (around the chain, not in the chain). Now make 1 dc in every next stitch and around every next ch-space. On the last step of the last st change colour to 1240/1820/1710. You now have 157 stitches.



**Row 115** (for pictures see row 98)

Ch 1. (does not count as a stitch). 1 dc in the first stitch and in all the others to the end. On the last step of the last dc change to colour 2017/2019/2010.

**Row 116** (for pictures see row 99)

Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch). 1 dc in the first stitch. \*Ch 3, skip 3 stitches and make 1 dc in the next st.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* to the end of the row. On the last step of the last dc change colour to 1240/1820/1710.

**Row 117** (for pictures see row 100)

Ch 3. In the 1<sup>st</sup> 3-ch space make 4 tr. Continue to make 4 tr in all 3-ch spaces to the end. Finish the row with 1 tr in the 1<sup>st</sup> dc of last row. On the last step of this tr change colour to 2017/2019/2010.

**Row 118** (for pictures see row 101)

Ch 1. Make 1 dc in between the 1<sup>st</sup> and the 2<sup>nd</sup> tr. So you are not crocheting it in the stitch on top, but you put your hook between the 2 tr and finish your dc as usual. \*Ch 3. Skip 4 tr and make 1 dc in between the next 2 groups of 4 tr.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* to the end of the row. So your next dc is in between the last group of 4 tr and the 3-ch starting ch of the previous row. On the last step of the last dc change colour to 1240/1820/1710.

**Row 119 to 126** (for pictures see row 100 and 101)

Repeat row 117 and 118

**Row 127** (for pictures see row 110)

Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch). 1 dc in the first stitch. \*In the 3-ch space make 3 dc. 1 dc in the dc in between the 2 3-ch spaces.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* until the end of the row. On the last step of the last dc change colour to 2018/1708/1054. You are now back at 157 stitches.



**Row 128** (for pictures of the next 5 rows see rows 27 to 31 of week 1)

Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch). 1 dc in the first stitch and in all stitches to end. On the last step of the last dc change to colour 841/842/851 of the Velvet yarn.

**Row 129**

Ch 3 and make 1 tr in the same stitch as the 3-ch. \*Skip 2 stitches and 3 tr in the next stitch.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* until you have 3 stitches left. Skip 2 stitches and in the last stitch make 2 tr. On the last step of the last stitch change to colour 1711/1001/1114.

**Row 130**

Ch 3. In the ch-space after the 2tr of the last row make 3 tr. In every opening between the 2 groups of trebles make 3 tr. In the last st (the 3<sup>rd</sup> of the 3 starting chains of the last row) make 1 tr. On the last step of this stitch change to colour 841/842/851 of the Velvet yarn.

**Row 131**

Ch 3 and make 1 tr in the same stitch as the 3-ch. In the ch-space after the 3tr of the last row make 3 tr. In every opening between the 2 groups of trebles make 3 tr. In the last st (the 3<sup>rd</sup> of the 3 starting chains of the last row) make 2 tr. On the last step of the last stitch change to colour 2018/1708/1054.

**Row 132**

Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch). 1 dc in the first stitch and in all the next to the end. Fasten off. If you are right there are still 157 stitches.



And now week 6 is done! Where does the time go? Concerning the Cal we are almost halfway, but concerning the middle part of the blanket we are over half. It's becoming quite nice isn't it?
