



There are 3 colour variations of the blanket. In the pattern I will give you the colour numbers to which you will have to change. The sequence will always be pink (Rose Scent) / blue (Sea Breeze) / green (Morning Dew). But you can always choose your own colours if you wish!

This week we'll be finishing our blanket. Then this CAL will be finished! This will feel so strange. I've been working on the preparations of this blanket for so long. And for the last 12 weeks you were all involved. Crocheting together. I am going to miss it!

#### Row 6

We are going to crochet the V-stitch.

Ch4 (counts as 1tr and 1ch). 1tr into st at base of 4ch. You now made 1tr (3ch), 1ch and 1tr into 1 single stitch. Now skip 2 stitches.

\*1tr, 1ch, 1tr in the next stitch. Skip 2 stitches.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* until the end of the row. In the corners you make 4 V-stitches with only 1 skipped stitch. You should look for yourself where to place those 4 V-stitches the best. Close the row by making a slip stitch through the 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of the first 4-ch.

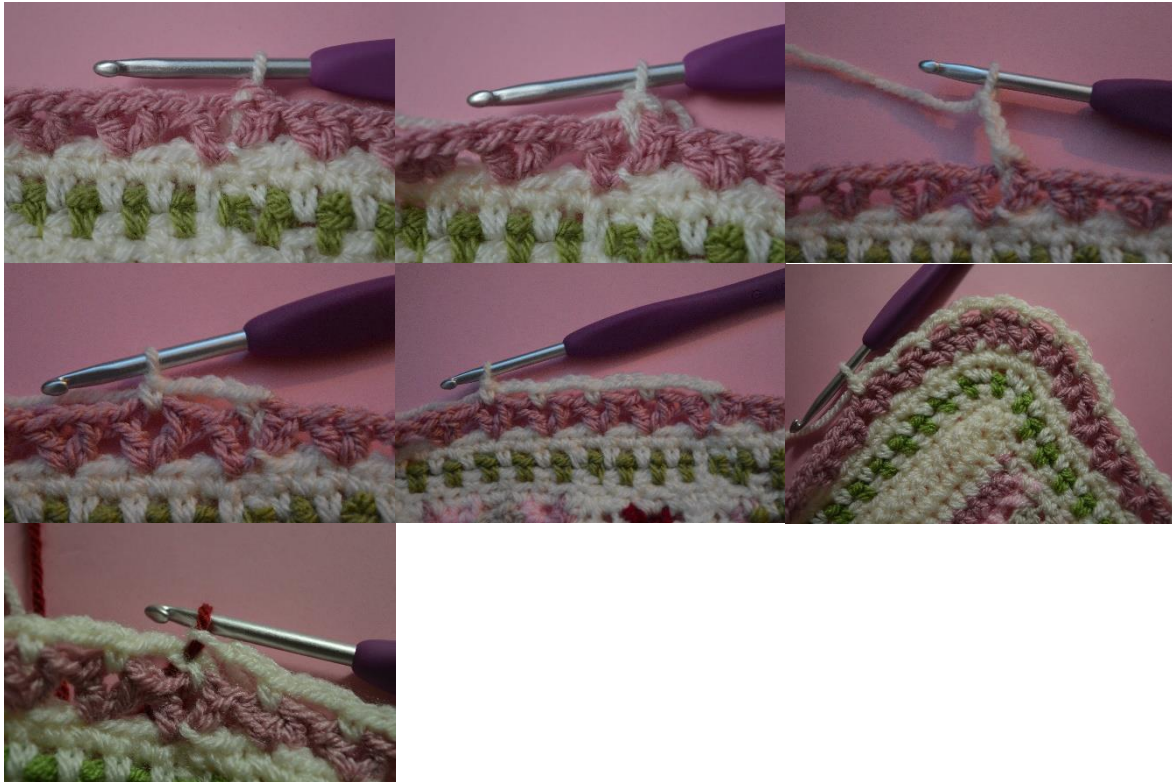


#### Row 7

Make a slip stitch in the chain before the next tr of the previous row. While doing this change to colour 1005/1203/1710.

Now make 1dc around the same 1-ch space. Ch3. \*1dc in the next 1-ch space, ch3\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* until the end of the row.

In the corners just continue in the same way. Close the row by making a slip stitch in the first dc. While doing this change colour to 1123/1725/1114. If your stitches don't come out right, this is the place so shuffle them around.



### Row 8

This is it! Really! The final row of this blanket!

Ch1. 2dc in the first 3-ch space, ch1 and again 2dc in the same 3-ch space.



\*In next 3-ch space, 2dc, ch1, 2dc\*\*. Repeat from \* to \*\* until the end of the row. In the corners you continue in the same manner. Close the row by making a slip stitch in the first dc. Bind off and darn in all ends.





I've pinned the four bow ties with a few stitches, so they would stay in place. Now the blanket is really finished. Isn't it a beauty? I'm sure we'll all have many nice moments with this blanket. And I hope to see many pictures of your blankets!



To get it nice and soft, and to make sure the bumps go out, you could block it. You can stretch it out on a bed, blocking mats or on some towels. For me, I tend to use old knitting needles. I put them through the sides and then pin them on the bed.





This was the last pattern of the Lossen & Vasten – CAL.
