



This week we'll begin with 198 stitches on the row. On the end of row 101 change to colour 1432/1004/2012/1302. Have fun this week!!

#### **Row 102**

Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 dc in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end. Fasten off.

#### **Row 103**

The **Pearl stitch** is up again.

Attach colour 1822/1080/2018/1083 in the first stitch of the other side of the row you just ended on.

Chain 3 (counts as your 1<sup>st</sup> treble). In the next stitch (the 2<sup>nd</sup>) make another treble. Around this treble you will make a 'pearl'. For this, do a yo and place your hook behind the treble you just made. Do another yo and pick it up. Repeat this 2 more times. You now have 7 loops on your hook. Do another yo and pull it through the first 6 loops on your hook. Make a final yo and pull it through the final 2 loops. You made your first 'pearl'! Skip 1 stitch, and in the next stitch make 1 treble. \*Make a 'pearl' around this treble. Skip 1 stitch and in the next stitch make 1 treble.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* to the end of the row. And the end, fasten off.

#### **Row 104**

Attach colour 1432/1004/2012/1302 in the first stitch of the other side of the row you just ended on. (3-chain starting chain)

Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 dc in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end. During the last step of the last dc, change colour 1009/1064/1099/1080.

#### **Row 105**

Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 htr in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end. During the last step of the last htr, change colour 1065/1130/1422/1081.



### Row 106

The **Iris Stitch**, that's what I called it in my first Cal. It's also known as the Star Stitch. In this Cal I stay with the Iris Stitch because the stitch of row 24 to 28 is also called the Star Stitch. Or else it would get to complicated.

This stitch has a clear wrong side. You can prevent this by making a row of dc's in the same colour of the Iris Stitch. But do remember that you begin that row on the other side of the row. For me, I've chosen not to do that, because in my opinion this stitch will become too high in comparison with the other stitches in this colour. And this blanket already has a very clear wrong side any way.



This stitch needs to be crocheted a little bit more loosely than the others, if not your work will start to pull. Therefore, for this stitch, it's best to use a hook 4½ mm.

Chain 3, pick up a loop through the 2<sup>nd</sup> chain stitch from your hook, and leave it on the hook. Do the same in the 3<sup>rd</sup> chain stitch from your hook. You now should have 3 loops on your hook. Now pick up a loop through the first stitch of the row (the stitch at base of the 3 ch st). Now you have 4 loops on the hook. Do the same for the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> stitch of the row. (6 loops on the hook). Now finish the stitch by pulling the yarn through all 6 loops. It should resemble a circle.





In that circle we'll begin the next eye.

\* You put your needle in the little hole that appeared. Yarn over and pull the yarn through. Pick up the next loop through the last stitch of the previous eye (not through a stitch of the last row). The 3<sup>rd</sup> loop you should pick up through the last stitch of the last row which you used for the previous eye. You should now have 4 loops on your hook. Loops 5 & 6 you get by using the next 2 stitches of the row. Finish the stitch by pulling the yarn through all the 6 loops.\*\*

Repeat from \* to \*\* to the last stitch of the row. Make 1 htr.



### Row 107

Chain 1. Make 1 htr in the centre of the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch. Make 2 htr in the centre of the first eye and in all the next eyes to the last eye of the row. In the very last eye make only 1 htr. Make 1 htr in the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch st of the 3ch stitch. You know have 197 stitches. Fasten off.

Isn't this the most lovely stitch?





### Row 108

Go back to your previous hook.

Attach to the other side of the row colour 1009/1064/1099/1080.

Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 htr in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end. During the last step of the last htr, change colour 1277/2010/1034/1820.



We are going to do a bit of masonry!!

### Row 109

Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 dc in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end.

### Row 110

Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 dc in the **front loop** of the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end.

You can see that every stitch is made up of 2 loops. This row is to be crocheted in the front loop of the two. You'll see the back loops nicely at the back side of your work.

During the last step of the last dc, change colour 1724/1005/1203/2010.



### Row 111


Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 htr in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end. This row is to be made through both loops. Fasten off.



### Row 112

On the other side of the row attach colour 1277/2010/1034/1820. In the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch (both loops) make 1 chain and 1 dc. In the next 3 stitches make 1 dtr. But you will not make these in the stitches of the previous row but in the loops you left untouched in row 110.

For this do a yarn over twice and put your hook through the loop you left untouched of the 2<sup>nd</sup> stitch in row 110. Do another yo and pull up a loop. Do another yo and pull it through the first 2 loops on your hook. Do another yo and pull it through the next 2 loops. Do another yo and pull it through the last 2 loops on your hook. Do just the same with the next 2 stitches.



\*The next 3 stitches are dc's. Just in the stitches below, both only through the **back** loops. It works just as with row 110, just not through the front but through the back loops.



The next 3 stitches are dtr again. These are made in the loops you left untouched in row 110. Do make sure you count your stitches, so that you are working in the right loops.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* to the last stitch. In the last stitch make 1 dc (through both loops). Fasten off.



### Row 113

Attach colour 1724/1005/1203/2010 in the first stitch of the other side of the row you just ended on.

Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 htr in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end. Crochet through both loops. Fasten off.



### Toer 114

On the other side of the row attach colour 1277/2010/1034/1820. In the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch (both loops) make 1 chain and 1 dc. In the next 3 stitches also make a dc, but in the back loops. \*In the next 3 stitches make 1 dtr. But you will not make these in the stitches of the previous row but in the loops you left untouched in row 112. In the next 3 stitches make 1 dc in the back loop.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* to the last stitch. In the last stitch make 1 dc (through both loops). Fasten off.



### Row 115

Attach colour 1724/1005/1203/2010 in the first stitch of the other side of the row you just ended on.

Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 htr in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end. Crochet through both loops. Fasten off.

### Row 116

On the other side of the row attach colour 1277/2010/1034/1820. In the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch (both loops) make 1 chain and 1 dc. In the next 3 stitches make 1 dtr. You'll make these in the loops you left untouched in row 114. \*The next 3 stitches are dc's, both only through the **back** loops. The next 3 stitches are dtr again. These are made in the loops you left untouched in row 114.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* to the last stitch. In the last stitch make 1 dc (through both loops).



### Row 117

Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 dc in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end. Fasten off.

### Row 118

On the other side of the row attach colour 1009/1064/1099/1080.

Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 htr in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end. In the last stitch make another htr. This way you are back at 198 stitches. During the last step of the last htr, change colour 1065/1130/1422/1081.

### Row 119

This row we will be making the **Thistle Stitch** again.

Chain 3, this is your 1<sup>st</sup> treble. Make 1 tr in the 2<sup>nd</sup> stitch. \*Skip 2 stitches and make 5 tr in the next stitch. Skip 2 stitches and make 1 tr in each of the next 2 stitches.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* until the end of row. On the last step of the last tr change colour to 1009/1064/1099/1080.

### Row 120

Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 htr in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end. During the last step of the last htr, change colour 1432/1004/2012/1302.

### Row 121

Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 dc in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end. Fasten off.

### Row 122

The **Pearl stitch** is up again.

Attach colour 1822/1080/2018/1083 in the first stitch of the other side of the row you just ended on.

Chain 3 (counts as your 1<sup>st</sup> treble). In the next stitch (the 2<sup>nd</sup>) make another treble. Around this treble you will make a 'pearl'. For this, do a yo and place your hook behind the treble you just made. Do another yo and pick it up. Repeat this 2 more times. You now have 7 loops on your hook. Do another yo and pull it through the first 6 loops on your hook. Make a final yo and pull it through the final 2 loops. You made your first 'pearl'! Skip 1 stitch, and in the next stitch make 1 treble. \*Make a 'pearl' around this treble. Skip 1 stitch and in the next stitch make 1 treble.\*\* Repeat from \* to \*\* to the end of the row. And the end, fasten off.

### Row 123

Attach colour 1432/1004/2012/1302 in the first stitch of the other side of the row you just ended on. (3-chain starting chain)

Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 dc in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end. The colour change is for next week.



We've done it. We crocheted all the rows! Isn't the stitch combination just so beautiful this week? I've enjoyed it very much!
