



Week 11. We'll be completing 'Home Sweet Home' today!! Are you ready? We'll be starting this week with 198 stitches. At the end of row 213 change to colour 1724/1005/1203/2010.

#### Row 214

Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 dc in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end. During the last step of the last dc, change colour 1432/1004/2012/1302.

#### Row 215

Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 dc in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end. Fasten off.

#### Row 216 to 246

Row 216 to 246 are rows that you can read from the chart below. Every square is a stitch. Every empty square is a dc and every crossed square is a popcorn stitch.

**Do you still want to see some pictures of the popcorn stitch? You can find them at row 36.**

You make the popcorn stitch as follows. You will be making 4 trebles that you don't finish. You do a yarn over (yo), put the hook in the stitch and pull up a thread. You do another yarn over and pull the thread through the first 2 loops on your hook. Repeat this 3 times more. When you did this 4 times you should have 5 loops on your hook. Now you do a final yarn over and pull it through all the loops in one time.

In between every popcorn stitch there is 1 dc. Also in between 2 rows of popcorn stitches there is a row with dc's.

I placed the chart here in 2 parts, with 1 line overlapping. On the chart with 'HO' I also placed the first line of the 'M' and on the chart with the 'ME' I've left the last line with the 'O'. This way you have a better view of where you are. So these charts are to be crocheted together, not separately.

Row 126 (this row) is the first row of the chart (the bottom one). You must read this from right to left. As you can see this is a row with nothing but empty squares, so all dc's.

On the other side of the row you just ended attach colour 1724/1005/1203/2010.

Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 dc in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end.

The next row is a row with the first sign of the letters 'HOME'. This one you read from left to right.

All rows begin with a chain stitch (does not count as a stitch) and a dc in the first stitch. The odd rows (the rows with a popcorn stitch in them) are made at the back. The bumps will jump to the front of themselves.

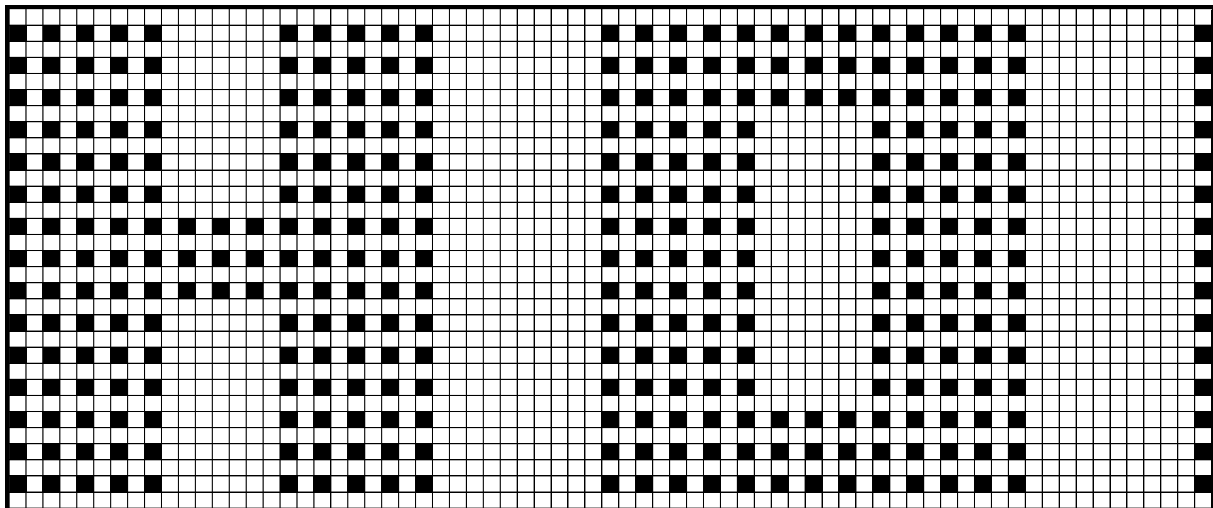
You begin in the odd rows with 1 chain and 32 dc's. After this begins the 1<sup>st</sup> letter. There are also 32 dc's on the other side of the letters (after the longest dash of the letter 'E').

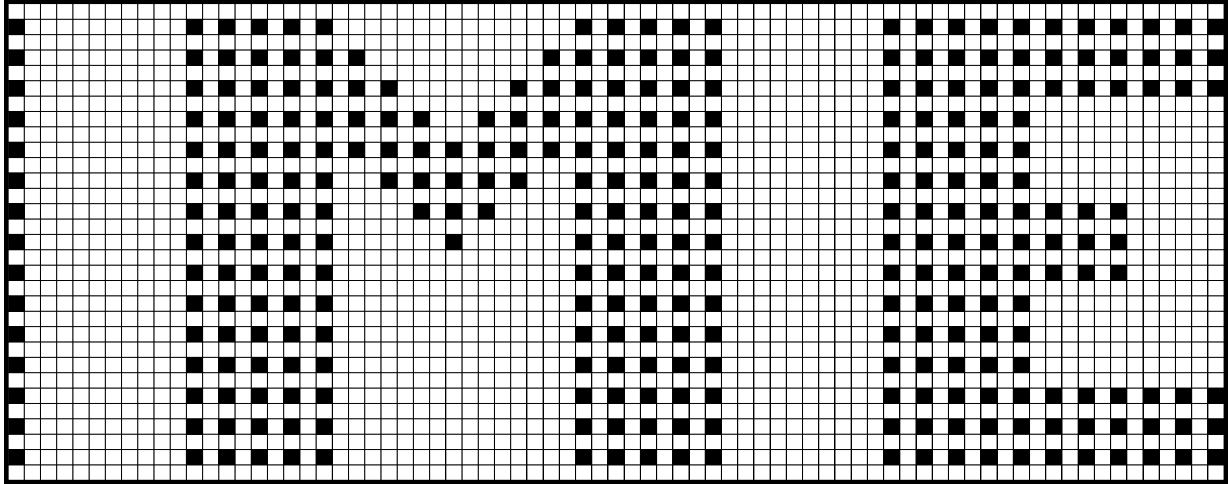
So you end, as you can see in the chart, with a row of dc's.

After row 246, fasten off.



Before the "H" and after the longest dash of the "E" are 32 dc's.





**Row 247**

On the other side of the row you just ended on attach colour 1432/1004/2012/1302.  
Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 dc in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end.  
During the last step of the last dc, change colour 1724/1005/1203/2010.

**Row 248**

Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 dc in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end.  
During the last step of the last dc, change colour 1432/1004/2012/1302.

**Row 249**

Chain 1 (does not count as a stitch). Make 1 dc in the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch and in every stitch to the end.  
Fasten off.



We're finished! Nice, isn't it? The theme of the blanket is now clearly printed upon it, homey at its peak!! Next week we'll continue!
